



## California Voluntary Carbon Market Disclosure Act (AB 1305)

CoreCivic reports energy consumption data and associated goals with reference to, or in accordance with, Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards. Our reports are publicly available on our [website](#). The information below is provided in response to Section 44475.2 of Division 26 of the California Health and Safety Code (“AB 1305”).

### Energy Consumption and Reduction Metrics

CoreCivic's real estate portfolio sees annual fluctuations in total square feet and proportion of facility types due to changing government partner needs. The type of facility and its mission play a large role in how utilities are consumed, and we organize our performance by facility type for the most meaningful year-over-year comparisons. Details on facility types and annual performance are located in our [ESG reports](#).

We apply an operational control boundary for our data, excluding facilities that we do not own or do not operate because we are limited in the types of energy conservation measures that we can employ. The supplemental environmental metrics tables in our [ESG reports](#) summarize our performance by facility type for the trailing three years.

Energy usage intensity (EUI) metrics are calculated by dividing the total amount of energy consumed (by facility type) by its corresponding total square feet. GHG reductions are calculated by aggregating all energy consumption, expressed as metric tons CO<sub>2</sub> equivalents, and comparing to the prior reporting period. Total emissions equivalents from the current reporting period are subtracted from the prior reporting period. We measure and report on progress annually.

Energy consumption goals are currently developed to achieve modest year-over-year reductions. CoreCivic is currently evaluating its environmental sustainability strategy and looks forward to exploring relevant sector methodology, emissions reductions pathways and third-party verification options moving forward.
